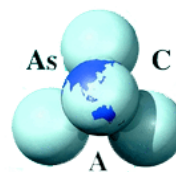

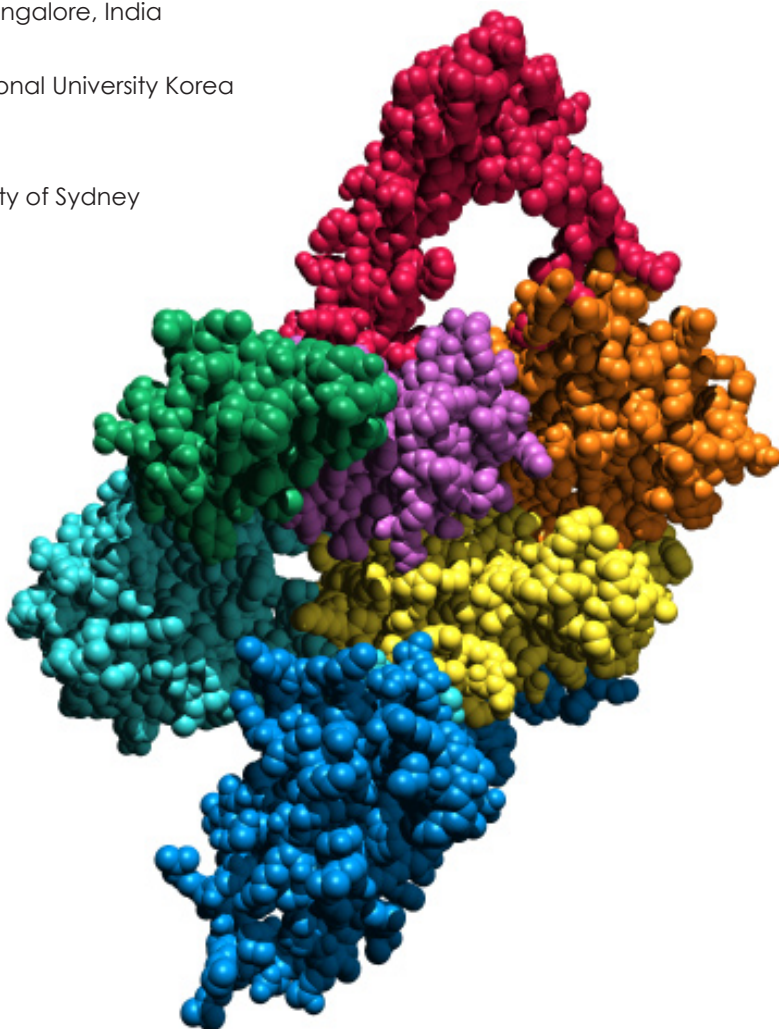

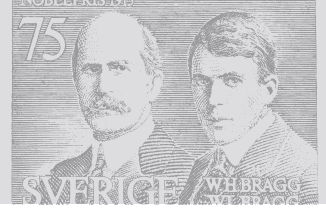

Bragg Symposium Venue

William Bragg had a close association with Elder Hall during his tenure as the Elder Professor of Physics at the University of Adelaide from 1886 to 1909. Part of the celebrated 'boulevard of culture and learning', Elder Hall is close to the Art Gallery, the South Australian Museum, and the State Library. The building is of historical significance and is registered by the National Trust.

General Information

Adelaide, South Australia

Skylink minibuses run between the airport and major city hotels every half hour from 7.00am to 10.00pm (hourly on weekends) at a cost of approximately \$7.00 each way. Taxis from the airport to the Adelaide Convention Centre will cost approximately \$20. Public transport is also available.

Dining in Adelaide

In Adelaide, you'll find entire streets devoted to dining. These 'eat streets' are a mix of cafes, pubs and restaurants. Gouger Street is the gateway to the Adelaide Central Market and the exotic, bustling mall and foodhalls of Chinatown. Take a five-minute stroll and you'll be embarking on a world tour of restaurants. Traditional Thai, Vietnamese, Malaysian and Japanese, Asian fusion, noodle bars, regional Chinese and yum cha, French and Argentine cuisine, and a number of first-rate seafood restaurants.

Rundle Street, in Adelaide's East End, has a popular casual atmosphere and is recommended for lunch and night dining. It's bursting with alfresco dining – a vibrant food, wine and coffee experience not to be missed. O'Connell Street and Melbourne Street are fashionable dining locations in North Adelaide, five minutes drive north of the city.

Parking

The Centre operates both the Riverbank and North Terrace car parks, which are open 24 hours, 7 days a week. Entry is via North Terrace. Early bird parking is available for \$11 per day if entry is prior to 9.30am and departure prior to 6.30pm. Beyond 6.30pm casual parking charges will apply.

Trading hours are generally Monday to Friday 9am–5.30pm, Saturday 9am–5pm and Sunday 11am–5pm.

Adelaide shopping in Rundle Mall and Rundle Street are open every Friday until 9pm and many are open week nights until 7pm.
